The architecture firm Wilmotte & Associés and the design studio Wilmotte & Industries SAS are active in both the public and private sectors, in the luxury, hospitality, residential and service sectors.

His work ranges from the architectural design of buildings to interior design and urban planning. 
Creation of the design 248

The door handle, a natural extension of the hand, is an instrument that has evolved and refined over time and in use. Wilmotte & Industries SAS saw its door handle as an evolution and adaptation of a universal instrument: the tool spanner, transferred to the domestic world.

The shape has been adapted to the palm of the hand and subtly and clearly guides the user's thumb into place. The handle is perfect and comfortable. The door handle is available in various designs and is as durable as the tool that provided its inspiration.

Design meets lighting technology

The mechatronic door handle enables the closing status of the door to be visualised using LED technology. Wiring of the door element is generally not necessary. Power can be supplied by a battery module or alternatively by an external connection to the mains supply.



HAFI Light Line - Design 248 (red / green)

- Permanent lights in red or green
- Continuous current required (e.g. via door hinge)
- Preferred for new buildings



HAFI Light Line - Design 248 (red / white)

- Temporary glow in red
- Battery operation (approx. 2 years battery life)
- Preferred for renovation projects



Hint

The Light Line product package also includes the modified DIN lock that is required for the locking indicator (open or closed). This is a DIN WC lock, spacing of 78 mm with 8 mm square spindle.

The "Château Pédesclaux" wine estate, which has been a listed building since 1855, is located in one of the most beautiful areas of Pauillac. As part of the modernisation of wine production, the building was to be made more efficient and at the same time blend in with the château's beautiful surroundings.


The château itself with its old slate roof was preserved, the wine cellar was rebuilt and the vineyards were restructured. The French architect Jean-Michel Wilmotte is characterised by the fact that his design is precise and sensitive down to the smallest detail.

Hotel Lutetia - Paris

The Hotel Lutetia is one of the most exclusive addresses in the French metropolis. The Lutetia was designed in 1910 by architect Louis-Charkes Boileau and is considered to be the first hotel in Paris to be designed in Art Nouveau (French Art Nouveau) style. In addition to an impressive façade, the building also has an Art Deco-style bar. During the major modernisation between 2014 and 2018, architect Jean-Michel Wilmotte attached great importance to preserving the original Art Deco architecture and, in collaboration with HAFI, designed a range of matching lever handles - 248 Premium Design.
